## Editor's Comment:

**There is significant voter support for expansion with 69% of respondents saying either “yes” or “yes with more oversight”. Males, younger voters and those without a college or post grad degree are noticeably more supportive.**

## METHODOLOGY

Our methodology uses an automated system that collects data over landlines and cell phones. Text messaging, internet responses and live callers are used as well. The random sample of registered voters is selected from our private data base as well as purchased from vendors such as Aristotle. The results reflect a representative sample of Massachusetts voters and are generally weighted for age, gender, region and race to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Our Director of polling is Louis DiNatale who was the Director of the UMass Poll at the former McCormack Institute at UMass Boston from 1996-2006 and principal researcher at Princeton Research Associates since 2006.
